

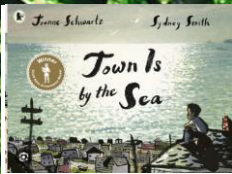
# Summer Two Term Year 4



## English

This half term, we will enjoy a range of exciting texts and writing activities. Using **George's Marvellous Medicine**, children will write their own recipes and instructions while developing their descriptive vocabulary. We will also study **A Midsummer Night's Dream** and write a witness statement based on events from the play. characters' perspectives. throughout the half term.

We are reading...



This half term, we will read *Town Is by the Sea* to develop our comprehension skills and deepen our understanding of characters, themes and vocabulary.

## Maths

This half term, children will develop their understanding of **time, shape, position and direction**. They will learn to read, write and solve problems involving time, identify and compare different shapes, and use mathematical language to describe position, movement and turns. Throughout our lessons, children will continue to develop their reasoning and problem-solving skills while applying their knowledge in a range of practical and real-life contexts.

## Science

This half term, children will learn about **changes of state** and **food chains**. They will explore how materials can change between solids, liquids and gases and learn about the different stages of the water cycle. Children will also investigate how plants and animals are connected through food chains and how living things depend on one another for survival. Through practical activities and discussions, they will develop their scientific knowledge and understanding.

## Art

This half term, children will use their creativity to produce artwork inspired by **food chains and habitats**. They will explore how living things are connected in nature and use a range of artistic techniques, materials and colours to create their own food chain-themed pieces. Through their work, children will combine their scientific knowledge with their artistic skills to create engaging and informative artwork.



## PSHCE

This half term, our *Changing Me* topic will help children understand how they grow and change over time. We will explore what makes us unique, learn about growing up and puberty, discuss how change is a natural part of life, and consider the exciting opportunities and challenges that lie ahead as we prepare for the transition to Year 5. Through discussion and reflection, children will develop confidence, self-awareness and respect for themselves and others.

## RE

This half term, children will explore the question, "**Do people need to go to church to show they are Christians?**" They will learn about different ways Christians express their faith and consider the importance of worship, community and personal beliefs in the Christian faith.

## Music

This half term, children will continue developing their ukulele skills as they prepare for their end-of-year showcase. They will practise a range of songs, including *Hey Ho* and *Somebody That I Used to Know*, building their confidence in playing, performing and working together as a group.

## Geography

This half term, children will explore **biomes and rainforests**. They will learn what biomes are, discover the different biomes found around the world and investigate the unique features of tropical rainforests. Children will also learn about the importance of rainforests

## Computing

This half term, children will be learning about **data, information and logging**. They will explore how data can be collected, recorded and used, and will learn how technology can help us organise and understand information.

## PE

This half term, children will be preparing for **Sports Day** by developing their athletic skills, including sprinting, jumping and throwing. They will also take part in obstacle course activities to improve their agility, balance and coordination. Later in the half term, children will begin a unit on **tennis** using the Get Set 4 PE scheme, where they will learn and practise a range of tennis skills through fun and engaging activities.
