

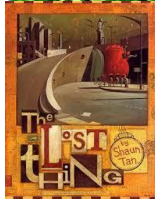
Summer One Year 3



English

We will be reading the text *The Lost Thing* by Shaun Tan. This is a humorous story about a boy who discovers a bizarre-looking creature while out collecting bottle-tops at the beach. We will use the text to write a narrative, a playscript and a persuasive email.

Maths

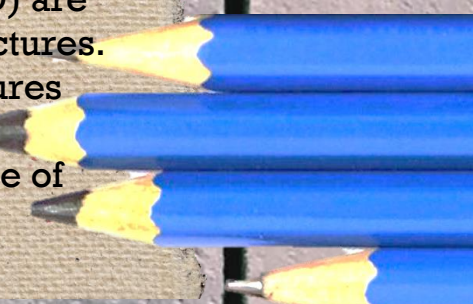
In Maths, children will continue their learning of fractions. Children will build on their understanding of numerators and denominators to unitise fractions and add them together. We will also look at money. Children consolidate their knowledge of notes and coins from previous years. They use £ and p notation and read monetary values as, for example, 5 pounds and 10 pence.

Science

In Science, children explore the different parts of a plant and their functions. In years 1 and 2, children observed and identified plant parts, such as roots, stem, leaves and flowers. In this step, children will recap the parts of a flowering plant, then look at their functions and why they are important to the plant.

DT

In DT, we will be using construction skills to build a structure with key features to appeal to a specific person/purpose. We will learn to recognise how multiple shapes (2D and 3D) are combined to form a strong and stable structures. We will learn how to re-enforce our structures by understanding that wide and flat based objects are more stable and the importance of strength and stiffness in structures.



Geography

In our geography unit, we will explore the continent of Europe and in particular look at Italy and Rome. We will build on our history lessons about the Romans coming to Chichester. We will look at how Chichester has grown and developed and why that is. We will then compare Chichester to Rome, examining similarities and differences.

RE

We are returning to our exploration of Sanatana Dharma – a self-identified name for Hinduism. Our big question centres around: What do some deities tell Sanatanis about God? We'll explore the belief in the deities and their aspects of the one supreme being which is Brahman. There will be a focus on Ganesha and Lakshmi and what particular blessings they bestow.

Music

With just three pitches (C-D-E) and four rhythmic durations, the combinations are almost endless! This unit shows how to make simple yet effective music using just a handful of elements, how to read and understand notation to capture compositions, and how to structure ideas. The resulting music will sound a little like a 20th-century American musical movement called minimalism.

PSHCE

PSHCE will focus on Relationships. We'll explore Family Roles and Responsibilities; Friendship; Keeping Myself Safe Online; Being a Global Citizen and Celebrating My Web of Relationships.

Computing

Stop-Motion Animation.

Can a picture move? They will learn about simple animation techniques and create their own animations in the style of flipbooks (flick books) using sticky notes. They will move onto iPads to create their final pieces of stop-motion animation.

PE

For indoor PE, we will be recapping the gymnastic moves learnt so far and creating new routines around a range of apparatus – including, for the first time this year, the wall frame!

Outdoors, the children will take their rackets skills and apply them to a bat as we learn how to play the exciting game of Rounders!
