



This approach helps pupils understand their emotions, take responsibility for their actions, and develop the skills they need to behave well and succeed in school and beyond.</p>	<p>We are building pupils' resilience and helping them embrace the learning process.</p> <p>Learning isn't about getting everything right the first time—it's about trying, making mistakes, and growing.
